ARTICLE

As I prepare to leave for Annual Conference, I do so with the knowledge that things are going to look a little different this year. This is because on April 22 at a Special Called Session of the Holston Annual Conference held at Central UMC Knoxville, the requests of 264 churches to leave The United Methodist Church was ratified with a nearly unanimous vote of 859 voting members. This leaves 578 churches remaining in the Holston Conference.

Let me address some of the questions I have been asked regarding this. First, the churches who have left (or "disaffiliated") are no longer part of the United Methodist Church. This may seem obvious, but even some of those churches do not seem to fully appreciate this fact. Special consideration was given to these churches to pay a certain amount of money and leave with their church buildings and properties. They are no longer under the leadership of our bishop or district superintendents. They will no longer receive pastors appointed to them by the UMC. They are either on their own or may join another denomination such as the newly formed Global Methodist Church. I learned at a clergy meeting last week that several UM pastors have also jumped ship.

About 2/3 of the churches that disaffiliated are smaller congregations with less than 100 members. Conferencewide, this will initially reduce Holston's membership from 148,580 to 117,378. Of the 25 churches in Holston with more than 1,000 members, only two of them are leaving.

Historically, the Methodist family tree has seen this sort of branching off with both parties going on to have successful ministries. I sincerely hope this is the case again. What does this mean for Bookwalter? For the time being, not much will be different. I am unapologetically a United Methodist pastor and have no intention of changing or leaving. We are still a United Methodist Church in the Tennessee Valley District of the Holston Conference. We may even potentially see some added members since many of the decisions to leave the denomination were not unanimous. In other words, there may be some people looking for a new UM home.

As I have said throughout this process, we will continue to do what we are called to do. This is simply to be in mission and ministry in the Inskip community. That is what we have done before and will continue to do.
