Thanks to ALL who recruited, organized, priced, arranged and sold items at the rummage sale. The sale raised a little over \$3,000. The money raised helped offset the costs of the soccer camp.

We held our first soccer camp and it was enjoyed by over 30 children from the Inskip Elementary School. Each child received a t-shirt and soccer ball to take home. We hope this can become an annual event. Thanks to Jason French for leading this effort and to all who assisted with it.

Kudos to Charles Gault for his relentless efforts in getting the tenant out of the parsonage and overseeing the sale. This was finalized around the end of September. The money received, minus expenses related to the eviction which we were able to keep, has been placed in an account with the Holston Foundation and will begin to earn interest which in the future we may be able to access.

We thanked Betty Lenoir in October as she retired with a reception recognizing her 20+ years of service as the church secretary. Betsy Payne has been hired to fill the church secretary position.

Scott Payne hosted a Contact Care workshop at Bookwalter for Seniors. It was informative and a good time for fellowship. They met again in December and more meetings are planned.

Another successful Trunk or Treat was held on October 27th. Approximately 14 vehicles participated, and we saw a steady flow of children. Thanks to Betsy Payne for leading the crafts activities for the kids. Thanks to all who helped coordinate and get everything set up and put up after the event!
