You need a small group because they're relational. That's important because life is all about learning how to love. And you can't love unless you build relationships. Small groups are the laboratory for learning relational skills. They're a laboratory for learning how to love.

You can't have a conversation with a crowd. But in a small group you can ask questions and share wisdom. In a small group you can pray in specific ways for each other, get support, and share the ups and downs of life.

You don't have to know everybody in the church for it to be your church. But you do have to know somebody. You need a few people who celebrate with you and show up when you need them.

ADVENT STUDY
